

State board to juggle with tuition increases

In yet another effort to ease the financial straits it has found itself in, the State Board of Higher Education directed staff last week to develop a plan that could raise tuition at the University while reducing tuition prices at Oregon's smaller colleges.

Tuition, other fees and dormitory rates at Oregon College of Education, Southern Oregon State College and Oregon Institute of Technology currently are closely comparable to those at the state's three universities.

A "tuition differential" plan, if adopted by the board, would alter the policy of keeping costs similar at various universities and colleges. That policy is based on the premise that the educational residence hall and other services are comparable within the state.

"The board tries to set tuition rates that attract certain types of students," says Keith Jackson, state system assistant budget director.

But the smaller colleges are having difficulty attracting students, Jackson says. Given similar prices students would ap-

parently rather attend the large institutions than smaller colleges, he says.

The board decided not to levy a non-resident fee at Eastern Oregon State College to combat declining enrollment at that school. But students remain a scarce commodity at La grande, Jackson says.

"EOSC can't offer the breadth of programs it should. It's on the verge of unused facilities," he says.

One alternative to reducing tuition and other costs at the small colleges is reducing programs, "but that conflicts with the objective of sustaining programs," Jack-

son says.

Because four times as many students are at the universities than at the colleges, a small increase in tuition at the larger institutions could generate a substantial decrease at the smaller colleges, Jackson predicts.

State system staff are now outlining affects of differentials of \$150, \$210 and \$270 — including both tuition and dorm rates.

"There's lots of options," Jackson says. "It's so complex. It's easy to talk about fiscal impact, but what will it do to the programs?"
