

Pre-registration offered

Starting Tuesday residents of the Eugene-Springfield area will be able to pre-register by mail or in person for more than 400 specially selected University courses to be taught during spring term, which begins March 28.

The early enrollment program is being conducted through the Community Education Program, which allows area residents to take six credit hours per term from the school's full range of courses at reduced tuition rates and without gaining formal University admission.

The pre-registration period will run through March 23 and will make available to the public courses dealing with Chinese language and culture, the geography of Oregon, the geology of the moon and planets and personal health and weight control.

Pre-registration forms will be available at the University Registrar's Office in Room 220, Oregon Hall and in copies of a Community Education Program supplement to appear in today's Eugene Register-Guard. The forms may be submitted in person or by mail.

Information on courses open for pre-registration will be listed in the Register-Guard supplement. Copies of the University's Spring Term Time Schedule of Classes, which lists all course for the term, are currently available in the Registrar's Office.

Persons who miss the March 23 pre-registration deadline or who want to take courses not included in the pre-registration program, will be able to attend a Spring Term Community Education Program registration session March 27 from 6:30 p.m. to 8 p.m. in McArthur Court.

Students enter opera contest for Northwest

Three voice students and a former voice student from the University School of Music were among the five finalists in the Oregon District Metropolitan Opera National Council auditions held March 4 in Portland.

Soprano Susan St. John, mezzo-soprano Julia Rhoda, bass Lawrence Evans and tenor Quade Winter are eligible for the Northwest regional auditions scheduled for March 13 in Seattle.

St. John, a doctoral candidate, has performed in several Eugene Opera productions and will sing with the Portland Opera Company in its 1979-80 production of Beethoven's "Fidelio." Rhoda sang in the University production of "Madame Butterfly" in May. Evans has been in several Eugene Opera productions and both he and Winter, a former University student living in Portland, have roles in forthcoming productions of the local opera company.

Winners of the regional auditions will be flown to New York City by the Metropolitan Opera for final auditions. Last year's Northwest regional winner is now performing with the Met.

Govan memorial set

Memorial services for Thomas Govan, professor emeritus of history at the University, will be held today at 4:30 p.m. at St. Mary's Episcopal Parish, 166 E. 13th Ave.

Govan, 72, died Monday at his home in Eugene after a long illness. He retired in 1977 after 10 years at the University. He was the author of many books and publications on U.S. history.

A second memorial service is scheduled Sunday at 4:30 p.m. in New York.
