

Icon expert to lecture

A former research associate at the State Historical Museum and the Andrei Rublev Museum in Moscow will give programs on Russian icons at the University Friday and Monday. Natalia Teteriatnikov will hold a colloquium Friday at 4:30 p.m. in Room 166 Lawrence Hall on the "Technique and Conservation of Russian Icons." Monday at 8 p.m. she will present a slide-illustrated lecture in the same room on "Andrei Rublev and the Moscow School of Painting in the 15th Century."

Teteriatnikov practiced and taught restoration of icons and other paintings at the National Central Scientific Research Laboratory in Moscow from 1968 to 1970.
