Prof to discuss architecture

A talk titled "The Writing on the Wall: The Language of Contemporary Architecture" will be given today at 7:30 p.m. in Room 204 Condon Hall.

Speaker Anthony Vidler, professor of architecture at Princeton University, was born in England and studied architecture at Cambridge University. His illustrated lecture will focus on modernism and explore the contradictory relations between architecture and society in the late Enlightenment.

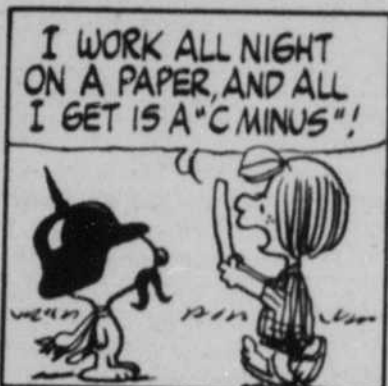
The "New State of Oregon Certification Requirements" become effective January 1, 1980.

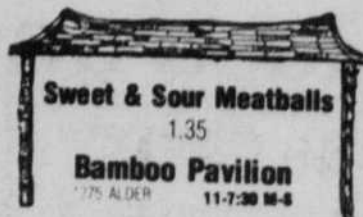
