## Geology needs artists, ideas for project

The University is inviting Oregon artists to design a mural, in any appropriate medium, for the outside south wall of the geology building.

Geology Prof. William Hosler says Oregon artists should submit their ideas in a brief proposal, accompanied by portfolios of previous works.

Although the individual artist or group of cooperating artists may use any workable medium, they are all asked to incorporate one or more of the earth sciences as the central theme for the wall.

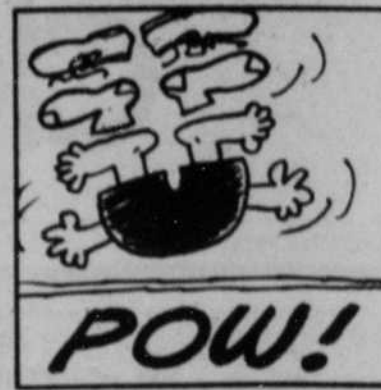
The artist or artists chosen to create the mural will receive \$3,000, funded by a private gift to the University.

The geology department office has prepared a brochure which contains a sketch of the geology building, its location, and more detailed proposal guidelines.

The south wall faces 13th Avenue, so it "should have a very large audience," Hosler states.

Proposals should be sent no later than April 6 to the Department of Geology, Room 144, Geology Building.
