The new course, taught in the Computer Science Department, is for people with no knowledge of computers. It will provide the non-programmer with an introduction to microcomputers covering such topics as the nature of computers, and their applications for home, small business and personal use.

The class will meet every Tuesday from 7 to 9:30 p.m. In addition, students will prepare and run programs and operate microcomputers in the department's microcomputer lab.

The course is open to the general public through the University's Community Education Program which allows registration without formal admission to the University at a reduced fee. The course is also open to regularly enrolled students.
