

# Duck trackmen fly past Bruins

UCLA men's track coach Jim Bush said he had reminded his squad all season about Oregon's potency. The Bruin's memories were refreshed Saturday afternoon at Hayward Field.

With 12,123 soaked fans cheering them on, Oregon took an 85½-68½ dual meet victory from the Bruins, which prompted Bush to say, "I know this is the best Oregon team I've ever seen."

"I told the team all along that the toughest team we would face would be Oregon," said Bush. "We just got the heck beat out of us."

In fact, the Bruins were beaten in three events they had been favored to win. Oregon garnered first place finishes in the long jump, high jump and triple jump.

Jon Ogard began the Duck onslaught by (leaping) 24-3 ¾ in the long jump. "UCLA didn't expect anything from me, just like no one else did," said Ogard.

"It wasn't really surprising," he continued. "I knew I could do it." Ogard admitted he was too serious in earlier meets. "I'm trying to relax more and have more fun with it. And it is starting to work now."

Jan From then won the high jump at 6-10. "I had one good

jump today and that was the one I needed," said From. "I was lucky. I have been having problems these last few weeks, and I had been working out a little too hard. This week I have taken it a little easier."

Gary Lacey quickly followed with a 50-4 ¾ effort in the triple jump, good enough to win the event. "I guess the Bruins weren't too worried about me," said Lacey.

The Oregon jumpers made up for Bruin freshman Eric Brown,

who swept the 100 and 200. Oregon's Don Coleman finished second both times by one-hundredth of a second.

Reider Lorentzen's 252-5 javelin toss outdistanced all other competitors by 34 feet. "I'm pretty happy," said Lorentzen. "The best part about it was the series (of throws). I was pretty consistent today."

While Ray Burton was win-

ning the discus with a 191-4 heave, Tom Hintnaus was going 17-0 in the pole vault, despite the rain.

"I wasn't on my form today," said Hintnaus. "I was just jumping to make the jump. It is hard to think about form in these conditions. Rain always makes it tough."

Winning six of seven field events, the Ducks then concentrated on their specialty, the

distance races.

Don Clary, Ken Martin and Larry Hurst swept the steeplechase. "We didn't know whether we could do it (sweep) or not," said Clary, who won with a 8:30.97 time. "Having Ken up there helped me a lot. I had him to key off of. I was worried we might drop off on the fifth or sixth lap. You lose your concentration at that point. But we just kind of pushed each other."

Rudy Chapa won both the 1500 (3:46.76) and 800 (1:49.79), but seemed more excited about the Oregon upsets in the field events.

"Our jumpers came through today," he said. "When they can come in as underdogs and end up coming through for us, it is a great feeling."

The upsets in the jumping events also excited Ron Thomas, who won the 400 meters in 47.37. "When those guys started winning, I was really sparked," he said.

The triumph was clinched when Oregon swept the 5,000 meters. Art Boileau was the winner, with Alberto Salazar and Bill McChesney following.

"I think we're capable of looking ahead to bigger things," said Oregon coach Bill Dellinger.

Or, for the jumpers, higher and longer things.

## Blazer's trail ends as Suns win series

PHOENIX, Ariz. (AP) — Paul Westphal scored 26 points and the Phoenix Suns outscored Portland 33-15 in the fourth quarter to take a 101-91 victory and capture their first-round National Basketball Association playoff series Sunday afternoon.

The Suns won the best-of-3 series 2-1.

Backing Westphal was Walter Davis with 23 points. Portland had three players scoring 16 each — Maurice Lucas, Mychal Thompson and Larry Steele.

Portland was on top 76-68 going into the final quarter but managed just four points in the first seven minutes of the quarter while the Suns poured in 20.

Davis had nine points in that final quarter and Mike Bratz contributed eight.

Phoenix went ahead 24-22 at the end of the first quarter while shooting 48 to 50 percent for Portland. During the first period the game was tied three times and the lead changed hands five times.

Phoenix won both games played here and meets Kansas City in the next round of play-offs.
