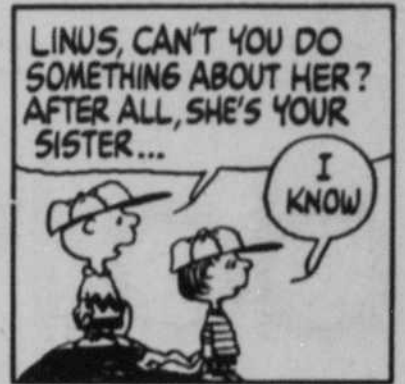
The rally is organized by a coalition of environmental action groups. Anyone interested in attending the rally should contact the Survival Center, 686-4356, for bus rides.
