Senate eyes program

A proposed International Studies program comes before the University Senate for approval at 3:30 p.m. in 229 Law.

CSPA prof. Clarence Thurber's motion would create an undergraduate, interdisciplinary program to prepare students for work in fields such as international communications and international business.

Under provisions of the motion, the program would be supervised by a University committee and would require that students complete 45 credits of interdisciplinary studies, plus three years of a foreign language or the equivalent.

The 45-credit block is divided into three areas: international relations, global perspectives and issues, and cultural studies.

The motion comes before the Senate following a study of the proposal completed by an ad-hoc committee appointed by Paul Olum, University vice president for academic affairs.

In other business, the Senate will hear Linguistics prof. Dale Sloat's motion providing for a review process to withdraw experimental courses from the curriculum if they duplicate established courses.
