Tours for the public of the new Lane County Adult Corrections Facility, 101 W. 5th Ave., will be held today from 1-10 p.m.

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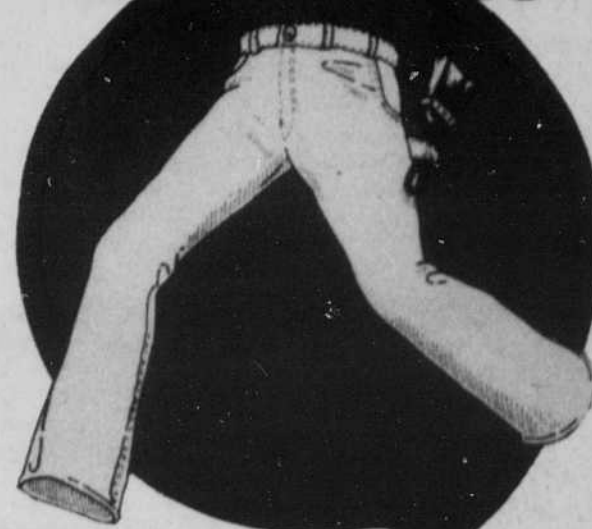
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
