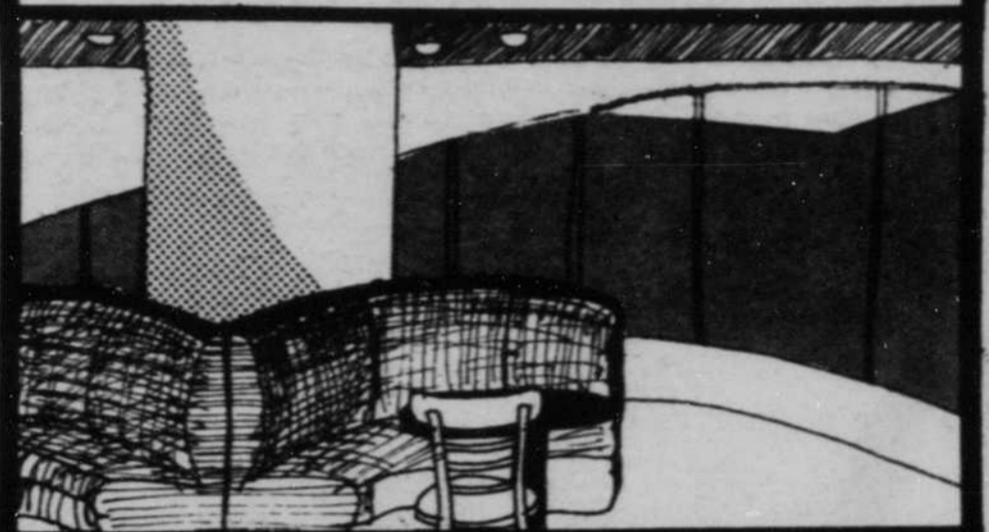

Seminar set to examine religious tales

John Dominic Crossan, professor of religious studies at DePaul University, will present a series of lectures today through Thursday at 7:30 p.m. in 150 Geology. The lectures on religious folktales and parables are sponsored by the University's religious studies department and are part of the annual Distinguished Lectureship series. Crossan's opening lecture will be entitled "World Treasure Tales" and will deal with the notion of treasure as a persistent theme in world folklore and literature. On Wednesday Crossan will deal with the theme of treasure in ancient Jewish stories, and on Wednesday with Jesus's treasure parable in the New Testament.

An informal meeting with Crossan also will be held Thursday at 3:30 p.m. at Koinonia Center, which houses the University Campus Interfaith Ministry, 1414 Kincaid St.

Crossan, a native of Ireland, has taught theology at DePaul University since 1969. He is the author of 44 articles and five books on the New Testament and on religious folklore.
