Thirteenth lucky for softballers

It took 13 innings, but revenge came sweetly for the University women's softball team Wednesday in Eugene as the Ducks outlasted Oregon State 1-0.

The game marked Oregon State's first appearance on the new diamond next to Hayward Field, but the Beavers showed confidence as they threatened

the Ducks repeatedly throughout the game. But the Oregon women remembering 1-0 loss to OSU earlier this season, staved off every threat, and won the contest when sophomore outfielder Lynne Conroy's single drove in Allyson Smith for the game's only run.

"I wouldn't say we were lucky," said Oregon coach

Becky Sisley, whose team collected only three hits during the marathon contest. "We're usually strong defensively, but we were terrible at the bat and we weren't aggressive."

The Beavers, meanwhile, made seven hits and seemed certain to score when they put three players on base with none out in the second inning. But freshman pitcher Lori Sweet collected an infield hit for a force-out at home plate, and catcher Sally Bickie then threw out the OSU runner at first base. The next OSU batter grounded out to end the rally.

Sweet, who has now given up only two earned runs in 101 innings on the mound for Oregon but said "I didn't hit well. I was very disappointed. I didn't really feel tired late in the game though; that's the way a lot of games go."

Basemen win again, 12-2

Home runs by Glen Baggerly and Steve Webber and a three-run triple by Mike Ritchey highlighted a 12-2 Duck win over Linfield College in non-league baseball action Wednesday at Howe Field.

The victory credited to pitcher Doug Strahm was the second straight for the Ducks, moving their record to 12-25.

The Ducks beat Lewis and Clark College 11-1 Tuesday evening in Portland, with Dean Kegler pitching the entire game for the Webfoots.

The University of Washington Huskies will provide the next challenge to the two-game Duck winning streak when they come to Eugene for a three-game Northern Division series beginning with a 3 p.m. game Friday at Howe Field.
