GOP legal opinion due

A legal opinion that could decide the fate of a battle over the Republican Party's recall of former GOP Chair Walter Huss may be issued as early as this afternoon.

Don Arnold, of the Oregon Attorney General's office, says he was assigned to research and write the opinion following a request for the ruling by an undisclosed official.

Huss, who announced his resignation as GOP chairer two months ago and then changed his mind, was removed from his position following a stormy convention Saturday in Eugene.

During the convention, Huss

maintained that the recall was illegal.

The conservative Republican contended that as a public official, he cannot be recalled without the approval of at least 25 percent of the state's registered Republicans.

Huss said Saturday he would consider a legal challenge to the recall after he receives the ruling from state Attorney General Jim Redden.

Although Arnold refused to speculate on that opinion's outcome, he says the matter will be simple to decide.

"I don't think this will be a complicated opinion," he says.
