The 11th annual Native American Student Union Pow Wow will be held today through Sunday at Mac Court.

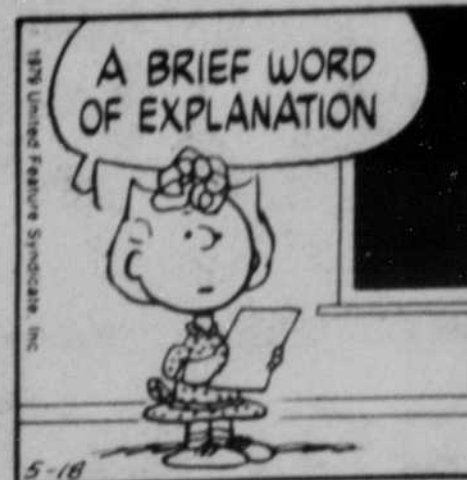
The festivities start at 7 p.m. today, with dancing competitions, drumming, and singing until midnight.
