### Wilderness slides on tap

Two wilderness-related events are scheduled this week on campus. Monday night, Tim Lillebo, eastern Oregon field representative for the Oregon Wilderness Coalition, and Bert Stillman, president of the Elk Foundation, will show slides of the North Fork John Day and Wapiti wildernesses in eastern Oregon.

Both of the areas have been recommended for non-wilderness status in the Forest Service's Roadless Area Review and Evaluation (RARE II) and are in some of the last unprotected wild country of the Blue Mountains.

Tuesday, the Oregon Student Public Interest Research Group and the Survival Center will sponsor a discussion of the "Economics of Wilderness" with Randal O'Toole and Bruce Farling.

The talk will begin at 7:30 in the EMU room to be posted.
