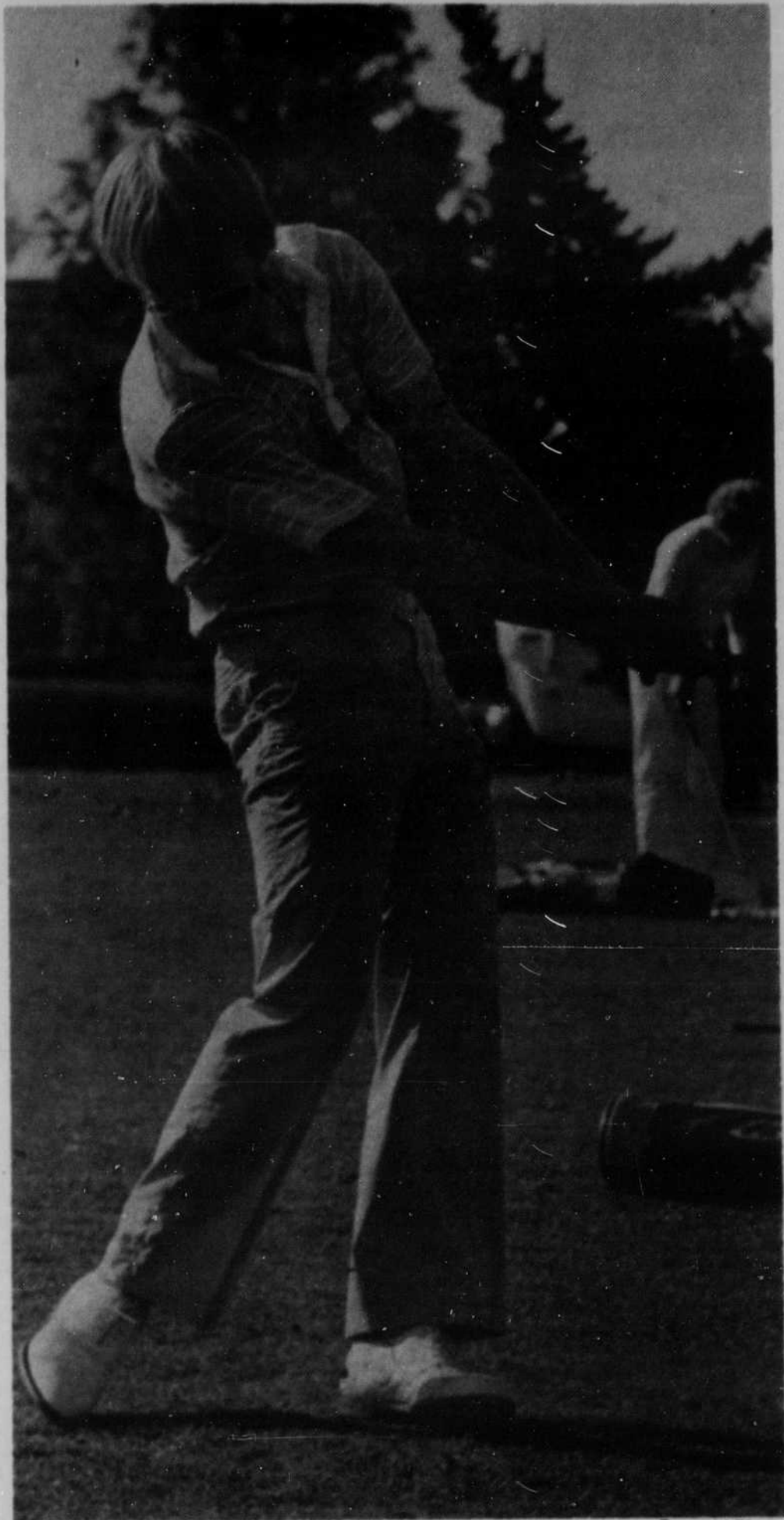


Ducks send Heselwood to national meet

Only one Duck golfer, Jon Heselwood, will represent the University at the NCAA golf championships this week in North Carolina. Heselwood, named to the Pac-10 all-star golf team, is expected to place in the top 20 at the tournament.

Duck golfer Jon Heselwood will be the University's lone representative at the National Collegiate Athletic Association golf championship in North Carolina this week.

The four-day, 72-hole tournament, which begins Wednesday, will be played at the par-72 Bermuda Run Golf Course at Wake Forest University, Winston-Salem, N.C.

"Jon is a fairly aggressive player," says Duck golf coach Jim Ferguson. "He thinks, he plays smart and he never loses control."

Heselwood has had a good year, says Ferguson. "He made the Pac-10 all-tournament team

and played really well at the start of the season. He hurt his back about a month ago, though, and has had a few problems since then."

A pulled muscle in his left side has kept Heselwood from getting the distance he needs, says Ferguson. "He isn't allowed the full swing, and he's steering the ball — disastrous to a golfer. He's getting better and his drives are starting to go, but I don't know if he is getting full shots."

Heselwood's short game hasn't been hurt by the back injury. "He's an excellent chipper and putter," says Ferguson. "He's accurate and on

the money, but then again most golfers have good short games.

"If Jon can get distance from his drives he should be in the top 20 at the tournament," Ferguson says.

The top golfers in the 187-man tournament should be Gary Halberg, Wake Forest University, Scott Watkins, Arizona State University, and Cory Davin, UCLA. "They're just about the best in the country," says Ferguson.

"It will be tough competition on a competitive course, plus they'll make the course as tough as possible — let the rough grow and narrow the fairways," Ferguson says.

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Canadiens extend streak

MONTREAL (AP) — Jacques Lemaire scored twice — including the second Stanley Cup winning goal of his career — and Rejean Houle added three assists as the Montreal Canadiens beat the New York Rangers 4-1 Monday and won their fourth consecutive NHL championship.

Before a jubilant crowd of 18,076, among them Prime Minister Pierre Trudeau, the Canadiens won the cherished silver trophy at their Montreal Forum home for the first time since 1968. They did it with the overwhelming skating speed and pinpoint passing that has been their trademark.

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
