

Diplomat to speak Friday

A diplomat and scholar from East Germany considered to be an expert on American politics, particularly the U.S. Democratic Party, will give two lectures Friday at the University.

Gerwin Schweiger, second secretary of the Embassy of the German Democratic Republic (GDR) in Washington, D.C., will discuss "The GDR Today" at 8:30 a.m. Friday in 138 Gilbert Hall. His address to a University political science class will be open free to the public.

Prior to his assignment in Washington, D.C., Schweiger served on the staff of the Institute of International Relations in Potsdam-Babelsberg, German Democratic Republic.

His visit to Eugene is sponsored by the University Russian and East European Studies Committee.

The aim of the exhibit is to provide insights into American colleges and universities.

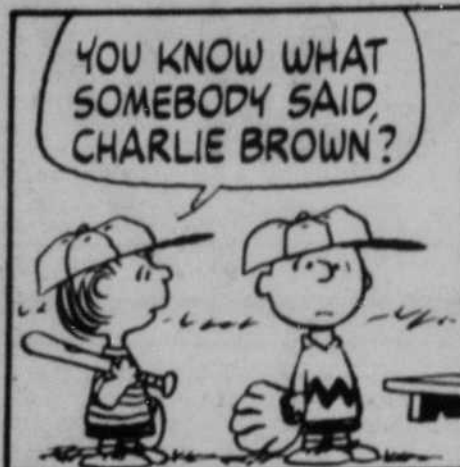
Late details on commencement now available
