

Saturn's rings explored

The rings around Saturn probably aren't the type of thin halos some scientists think, according to University astronomers.

The researchers say they've obtained evidence at the University's Pine Mountain Observatory in central Oregon and at the Kitt Peak National Observatory near Tucson, Arizona, which contradicts one theory that the planet's two main rings are thin, single layers consisting of bodies, perhaps less than a foot thick, positioned side by side.

University physics Prof. James Kemp directed the NASA-funded University research effort along with research assistant Paul Johnson.

The University group's measurements were taken from December to April. Assisting with the project, funded with a \$12,800 grant from NASA, were research assistants Randy King and Tim Parker.
