GOP auditors gain little assistance

An audit of the Oregon Republican Party has had trouble gaining the cooperation of some of those being audited, says GOP audit committee chairer Lou Swayze of Portland.

Gaining that help has been "the biggest problem the audit has encountered," says

Swayze, who has scrutinized GOP financial records for the past three months.

Swayze adds that, so far, the audit has found only a few record-keeping problems, which can easily be corrected. Other problems include inadequate records of expenses and revenue from previous years.

findings, the financial records of the party for the past four years are "confused and not up

Former GOP Chairer Walter Huss called for the audit to clarify discrepancies in the party's finances and to end allegations that he mismanaged the party's money

Swayze and four other party members were appointed to the audit committee by Huss in February and were reappointed by new Chairer Dr. Robert Voy after he replaced Huss earlier this month.

The committee is now trying to finish the investigation, Swayze says. "But the problem with the audit is that one thing we find just leads to another

the leads to items they think might be important, but so far they haven't found any financial discrepancies to suggest that funds were not documented by former leaders, Swayze says.

Once the audit is completed, which could be within the next few months, the information will be turned over to an independent auditing firm for an outside audit of the party, Swayze says.




