Zoologist set to head new science group

A leading U.S. scientist will join the University faculty to direct a teaching and research program in the neurosciences.

Michael Menaker, 44, currently at the University of Texas at Austin, will begin setting up his new laboratories next month and will join the University faculty in September.

His credentials include influential research in the study of "biological clocks" in the brain.

Menaker, who joined the Texas faculty in 1963, holds a bachelor's degree in zoology from Swarthmore College (Penn.) and a doctoral degree in zoology from Princeton University.

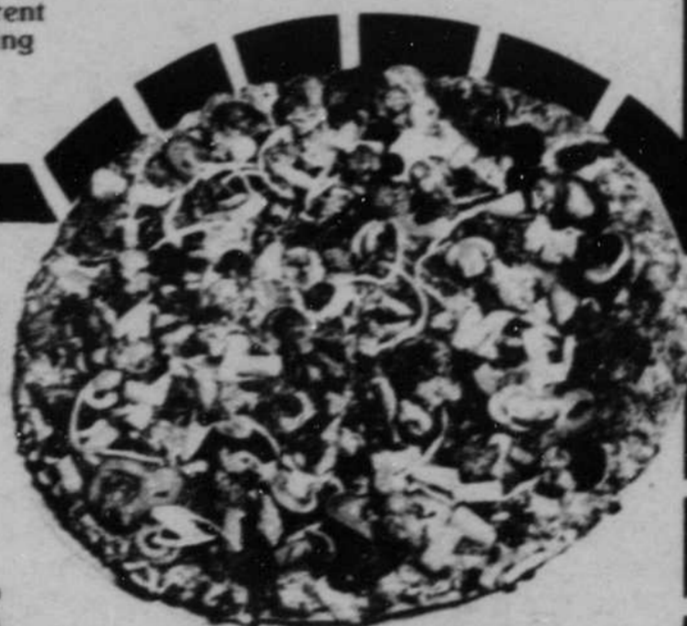
