

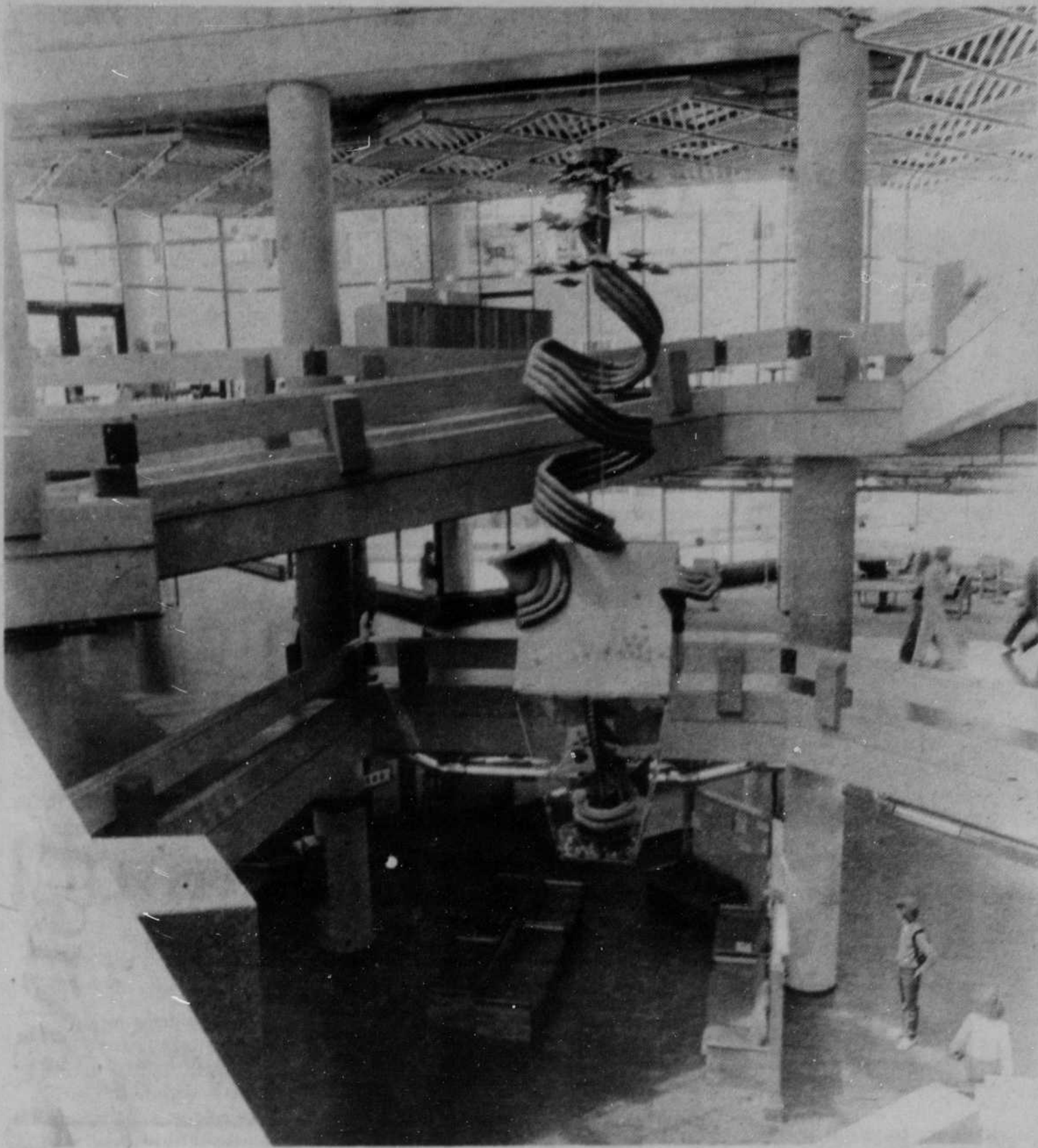

EMU: Beer garden, games, food, crafts are right here

With hot weather inevitable through summer session, the Erb Memorial Union Beer Garden is sure to be a popular spot every Thursday from 3 to 6 p.m.

Sponsored by the EMU Cultural Forum, the Beer Garden is open to anyone age 21 or older. It takes place in the screened-over courtyard on the main floor of the EMU.

The EMU provides many varied services throughout the summer, from food to government. A popular spot for food is the Fishbowl, also on the main floor. It houses a fountain and the Delicatessen, which specializes in meats, cheeses, salads and breads.

Next to the Fishbowl, the cafeteria provides breakfasts and lunches. The menu offers a variety of main dishes and desserts and features a daily special.

One of the most unusual eating areas on campus is probably the Skylight, located on the second floor of the newer addition to the EMU. It sells soups, salads, vegetarian sandwiches, desserts, and beverages under a 4000 square foot skylight which overlooks the area east of the EMU. The eating area is equally well known as a study area, with tall, circular booths providing a quiet atmosphere.

Directly below the Skylight, the Main Desk sells school supplies, candy, drugs, film, magazines and even plants. The ticket-check area of the Main Desk cashes checks of up to \$5 until 4:30 p.m. and up to \$10 evenings and weekends. It also develops film, accepts telephone bill payments, sells bus tickets, Ashland Shakespearean Festival tickets and concert tickets and also sells Oregon Daily Emerald classified ads.

Bowling, billiards, pinball, foosball, and table tennis can all be found in the Recreation Center in the basement of the building. The Rec Center is open until 1 a.m. Friday and Saturday nights and

until 11 p.m. the rest of the week. Also in the basement are the Asian and Black Student Unions, the Hair Today Salon, the EMU Print Shop and a Baskin-Robbins ice cream shop.

Across the breezeway from the Rec Center is the ground floor of the new addition. Here students can find the Crafts Center, where formal and informal instruction in several crafts is available in a well equipped work area. Work areas include darkrooms, a woodshop and areas for textiles and leather work, jewelry, ceramics, graphics, and lapidary.

For students with babies or small children, the Child Care Center provides a state and federally-certified day care program. It allows for part time and occasional use with hourly fees. Next to the Craft Center, it is open from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and from 6 to 10 p.m. Monday through Friday.

The ground floor also houses a variety of student organizations, including the ASUO student government offices in Suite Four. Other suites provide offices for such programs as OSPIRG and the Survival Center, which have information on many environmental and consumer affairs issues.

On the south side of the building is the Outdoor Program Office, with recreational information, student-organized trips and equipment. Next to the southeast entrance to the building is Oregon Wilderness Supplies, a state agency offering different kinds of packs, sports clothing and boots, and camping and hiking equipment.

Back in the main part of the building, there is a U.S. Post Office on the first floor facing 13th Street. The stairs across from the Post Office lead to the International Student Union and Lounge, which provides another quiet place to study.

On the third floor of the building is the ESCAPE office. Here students can arrange to earn academic credit in a non-traditional class situation. Also on the floor are the Women's Referral and Resource Center, the Chicano student organization MEChA, the Gay Peoples Alliance and the Oregon Daily Emerald offices.

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
