Portland gays celebrate

Portland's gay community will celebrate Gay Pride Day Saturday, June 23 in Portland's downtown area.

The celebration marks the 10th anniversary of the Stonewall Resistance, when lesbians and gay men fought police harassment in New York for the first time. The event which led to the modern gay civil rights movement.

"Gay Pride Day has been set aside as the time we honor our accomplishments and reflect upon our progress," says Carl

Goodman, executive director of the Portland Town Council.

Portland's celebration will begin at noon at the Pioneer Courthouse, on the corner of S.W. 5th and Morrison streets, where lesbians, gay men and their heterosexual supporters will gather for a march from the courthouse to the north end of Waterfront Park, across from Portland's Saturday Market.

After the parade has arrived a rally, "intended as an opportunity for people to embarrass their homosexual brethren," is

scheduled.

Rep. Gretchen Kafoury, D - Portland, will deliver the rally's "keynote address," says Goodman. Spokespersons from the Portland Town Council, Lesbian Parenting Alliance, Metropolitan Community Church, American Friends Service Committee, and other groups will also address the Gay Pride Day celebrants.

"The day is intended as an ethnic celebration rather than a political event," Goodman says.
