

Summer enrollment repeats 1978

About 7,000 students are expected to enroll for summer session at the University, says Wanda Johnson, registrar.

According to Johnson, 27 percent of the students who attended spring term are going to

school this summer. This means that about 50 percent of the students now enrolled are continuing students from last spring. A majority of the other summer students are teachers returning to upgrade their credentials, says Johnson.

Psychology course opens

This summer a course on "Population Psychology" is being taught at the University. The class will focus on individuals' and couples' beliefs, attitudes and motivations toward having children, family size preference and birth control.

The three-credit course, not listed in the summer schedule of classes, is a 400-level class meeting throughout the term on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 12:30-2:20 p.m. in 159 Straub.

The class will discuss population issues that are often ignored: subjective reactions to particular contraceptives, the effects of family size on parents and children and the effects of changing women's roles on family planning and family structure.

The course will also confront cross-cultural issues like the motivation for, and the psychological effects of migrating to another country.
