

Smog caused by slash fire, not field burning

Eugene suffered its first major smoke incursion of the year early Thursday afternoon, but the culprit wasn't field burning; smoke from slash burning in the Coast Range blanketed the metropolitan area.

Marty Douglass of the Lane Regional Air Pollution Authority (LRAPA) said "for two or three hours it could be classified as a serious smoke intrusion." Douglass said smoke from 40 acres of burning slash in the Mapleton Ranger District of

the Siuslaw National Forest entered the Eugene area about 11:15 a.m. and had reached serious levels by noon. Conditions returned to normal by 3 p.m.

LRAPA uses an instrument called a nephelometer for immediate readings on air quality. Nephelometer readings reached 6.8 at 12:15 Thursday — Douglass said a major intrusion would read 3 or 4 on the machine. A pollution alert, which is officially determined from other instruments, would read about 10 on the

nephelometer, according to Douglass.

Smoke from slash and field burning often creates health hazards for Eugene area residents during summer months and has become a major political issue in the state legislature. The Legislature passed a bill earlier this year raising the allowable field-burning limit to 250,000 acres beginning in 1980. This bill is being contested in court by the City of Eugene and Rep. Nancie Fadeley, D-Eugene. City attorneys were not available to

comment on the status of the lawsuit.

Last year the city agreed to a 180,000 acre limit despite a federal Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) limit of only 50,000 acres. The Oregon Department of Environmental Quality is currently petitioning the EPA for permission to burn 180,000 acres again this year.

The field burning season officially began Sunday but burning usually doesn't get underway until the middle of the month.
