Little red school house will return

A piece of nostalgia may be coming to the University if the College of Education's plans for a "little red school house on the hill" are successful.

The College has the building — its 57-year-old Education An-

nex — but currently is seeking an old-time school bell to cap the project.

The effort was started last winter when the University broke ground for a new education wing. The structure that

houses the college's field placement program had to be moved out of the way to a low hill between the music school and the education building.

Staff of the education department decided the small, one-story building would look appropriate with a red paint job, a cupola on the roof and an old school bell. Finding the bell, however, has proved to be a difficult task.

Such bells were common in Oregon when one- and two-room school houses were found in almost every town, but when consolidation and modernization came to the education system, the bells were bought up by museums and private collectors.

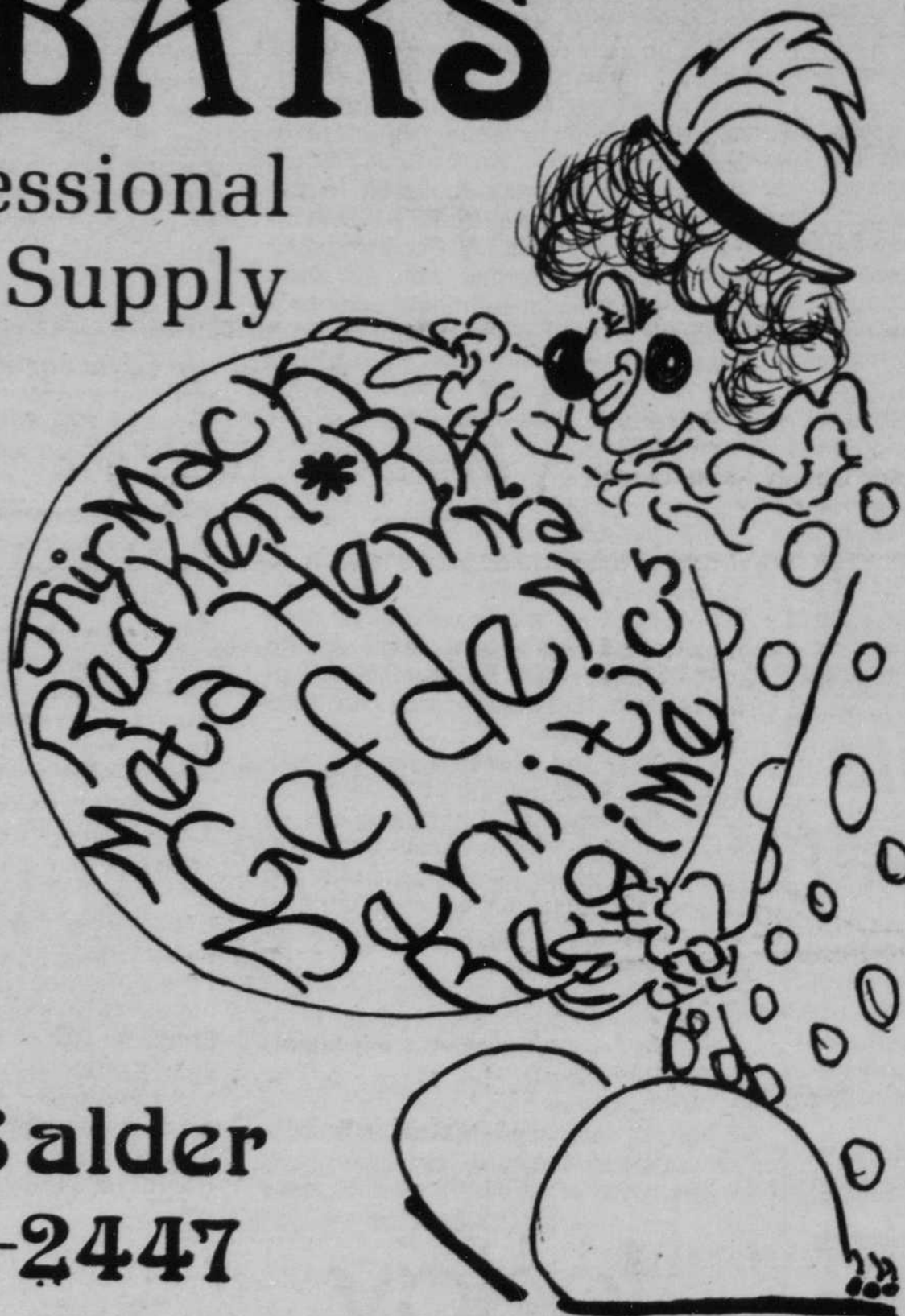
