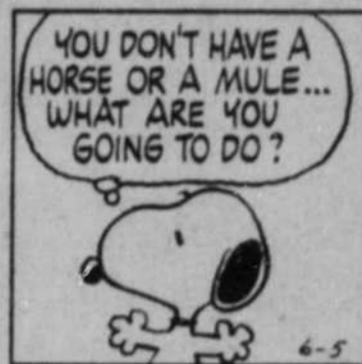
Psychology head Robert
