Affirmative action probed

Three officials from the federal Office of Civil Rights (OCR) in Seattle will conduct a compliance review at the University of Oregon beginning Monday as part of a regular, nationwide review process.

Socorro Rodriguez, chief of the Oregon-Idaho Branch of OCR's Postsecondary Education Division, and two investigators will be on campus, according to Norma McFadden of the University's Affirmative Action Office.

McFadden said the OCR officials will review two areas — graduate admissions and student placement — to check the university's compliance with non-discrimination laws covering race, color, national origin, sex and, in the case of job placement, handicapped status.

According to McFadden, the officials asked that the University community be informed of the upcoming visit. She noted they will have an office in Johnson Hall, and may also be reached by telephoning 686-3083. Individuals may also call the Affirmative Action Office, 686-3123, to arrange an appointment with the visiting OCR team or for more information on the visit.

ERIC computer displayed


