Funding applications due soon

Only a few more weeks remain to apply for 1980-81 Fulbright grants for study abroad. Qualified graduate students and seniors graduating by September, 1980 may apply for one of 505 awards available to 50 countries.

Most of the grants offered provide round-trip transportation, tuition and maintenance for one academic year; a few provide international travel only or a stipend intended as a partial grant-in-aid.

Applicants must be U.S. citizens at the time of application, must generally hold a bachelor's degree or its equivalent before the beginning date of the grant and, in most cases, should be proficient in the language of

the host country. Except for certain specific awards, candidates may not hold a Ph.D. at the time of application.

Creative and performing artists are not required to have a bachelor's degree, but they must have four years' professional study or equivalent experience. Social work applicants must have at least two years of professional experience after the Master of Social Work degree.

These grants are sponsored by the Fulbright Program and by foreign governments, universities and private donors. Application forms and further information may be obtained from the Fulbright Program Advisor, Thomas Mills, in 172 Oregon

Hall. The deadline for filing application is Oct. 17.

Another set of stipends are available through the National Endowment for the Arts. Qualified faculty members are eligible for two months of support under this endowment. The University can nominate three junior or senior faculty members for these stipends.

The scope of the endowment support includes, but is not limited to, the study of history, philosophy, languages, linguistics, literature, archeology and those social sciences which employ historical or philosophical approaches, such as cultural anthropology, sociology, political theory and international relations.

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Consul general lectures

Jiro Nishikawa, consul general of Japan at Portland, will speak on "Mutual Relationships between Oregon and Japan" at 1:30 p.m. today at the EMU, room to be posted.

The lecture, sponsored by the Asian Studies Program, is open to the public and will be followed by a film entitled "Understanding the Japanese."

Nishikawa has represented Japan as consul general in Dacca, East Pakistan, and in Porto Alegre, Brazil. He was director of the research department for the Institute of Asian Economic Affairs in Tokyo from 1961 to 1964 and director of the Diplomatic Record Office of the Foreign Ministry, also in Tokyo, for one year before moving to Portland in 1978.
