

Classes explore politics

A course entitled "Political Campaigns," designed for campaign managers and candidates, is offered at Lane Community College this term. Class will begin at 7:30 p.m. Thursdays in Room 111 Science at the community college. Instructor Tonie Nathan will cover the step-by-step process for organizing a political campaign and critiquing the candidate and opponents.

Some topics to be included are fund raising, motivating volunteers, public relations, campaign materials, media contact, research and issue isolation and legal requirements for office.

Nathan is also teaching a Tuesday evening "Public Image Workshop" for potential political candidates, public speakers and others. The course will begin at 7:30 p.m. Tuesdays, in Room 252 Math/Art at the community college.

Nathan will rely on videotape, role playing and classroom exercises to allow students to critique their performances and receive feedback on their image and ideas as projected to mass audiences. Participants in the image workshop will have the opportunity to practice statements of ideas, requests for funds and volunteer help, telling jokes, introductions, answering questions and dispensing information.
