

Records easy to get

For students who don't know general University requirements, college life is a gamble. They pick classes, hoping that their choices will add up to a degree at the end of four years.

But a quick trip to their department or school office will bring them up to date on how far along they are in fulfilling general University requirements.

At the end of each academic year the registrar's office prints unofficial transcripts for each student and distributes them across campus to the various departments and schools. All a student needs to do to receive a copy of the transcript is to ask for one.

Included on the transcript is a list of all courses and the grades and credits received for them. The transcript also includes class standing, transfer credit earned, University hours graded, University hours not passed and total University credit hours earned. The two types of credit hours are then combined as total hours graded, total hours not passed and total credit earned.

The transcript also records any academic actions in the student's record.

In the bottom right-hand corner, the transcript lists requirements completed toward bachelor's degrees. For a bachelor of arts degree, the total number of hours taken that fulfills the 36-hour language and literature requirement is listed.

Next, the transcript records whether the B.A. language requirement has been met. For a bachelor of science degree, the total number of science hours taken and the total number of social science credit received is tallied. For a B.S. degree, a student must take 36 hours in either science or social science.

The transcript records students' general progress in both degrees, regardless of whether they have decided on either one.

Also tallied on the transcript is the number of writing, health and physical education classes taken. To graduate, a student must complete six hours of writing courses with a grade of C or better, one health class and five terms of physical education activity courses.

Also recorded is whether 85 percent of the total hours taken received a grade of A, B, C, D or P. Added as a "quality check" is whether 90 percent of the A, B, C, D and P hours were graded A, B, C, or P. Although it's no longer a requirement, the 90 percent information may alert students with low grades that they're in danger of failing the "85 percent" requirement.

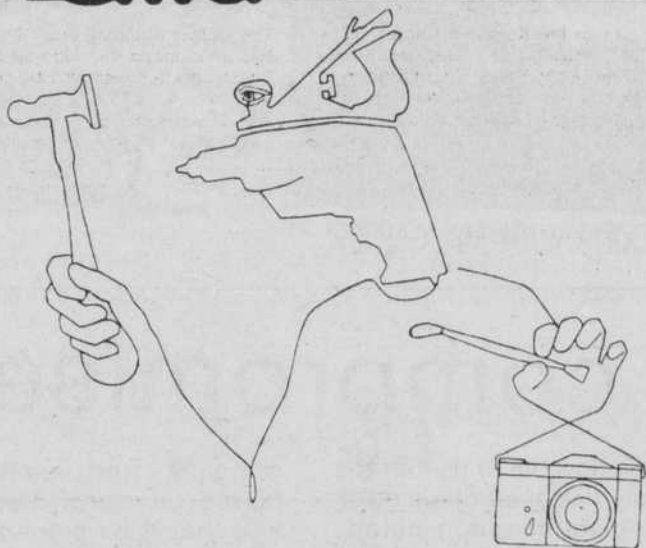
