



Fraternities pledge more men

About 150 men have pledged fraternities at the University this fall following a week of formal rush activities.

About 220 men — 10 more than last year — signed up for formal rush according to Mike

Kehoe, a Portland senior and president of the Interfraternity Council. Fourteen fraternities participated in rush.

Formal pledge numbers have remained fairly constant in recent years, Kehoe says.

A number of men probably will pledge during informal rush in coming weeks, Kehoe says.

University fraternities usually add about 250 members through informal rush during the year, he adds.

Attorneys will lecture

Prominent trial lawyers from Ohio, Washington and Oregon will speak at a symposium for law students and attorneys on Oct. 13, at the University of Oregon School of Law.

"The Anatomy, Strategy and Philosophy of a Trial" will run from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the University Law Center, Room 129. The meeting is open to the public, and free.

Symposium topics will include basic trial strategy, jury selection, opening statements, cross-examination and principles of the closing statement.

Key speakers include Richard Markus, Cleveland; Daniel Sullivan, Seattle; and Charles Burt, Salem.

Markus chairs the National Institute of Trial Advocacy board of trustees. He also is past national president of the American Trial Lawyers' Association.

Sullivan is the Western Trial Lawyers' Association president, and is past-president of the Washington Trial Lawyers' Association.

Burt was recently elected as Oregon State Bar president and serves on the WTLA board of governors.

Attorneys from Eugene and

Portland also are slated to speak. Among these are Richard A. Roseta and Donald Loomis of Eugene who will present a cross-examination demonstration at an afternoon session.

The symposium is sponsored by the WTLA, Oregon Trial Lawyers' Association and the Moot Court Board of the University law school.

Curator to talk

Drawings from the walls of ancient Egyptian tombs will be featured in a slide-show presentation on Oct. 22 at the University.

Art historian William Peck will speak on "Tomb painting in the Theban Necropolis," at 8 p.m. in Lawrence Hall, Room 107. The program is free and open to the public.

Peck is curator of ancient art at the Detroit Institute of Arts. He has authored the book "Egyptian Drawings" that also has been published as "Drawings from Ancient Egypt."
