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Health center offers vaccinations

Vaccinations for influenza will be given at the University Student Health Center today and Thursday from 8 a.m. until noon. Students, faculty staff may receive the vaccine at a cost of \$2 per dosage. Persons under the age of 27 will receive two doses of vaccine four weeks apart unless they received one dosage of the 1978-79 vaccine. The vaccine contains Type A Russia, Type A Texas and Type B Hong Kong. Annual flu immunizations is especially advised for people with an increased risk of complications from lower respiratory tract infections including: 1) Persons 65-years-old and older. 2) Persons of any age over 5 months with the any of the following: heart disease, compromised lung functions, chronic kidney disease, diabetes, chronic severe anemia and conditions which compromise immune mechanisms. 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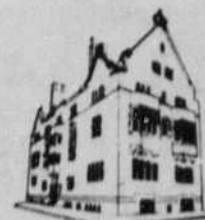
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
