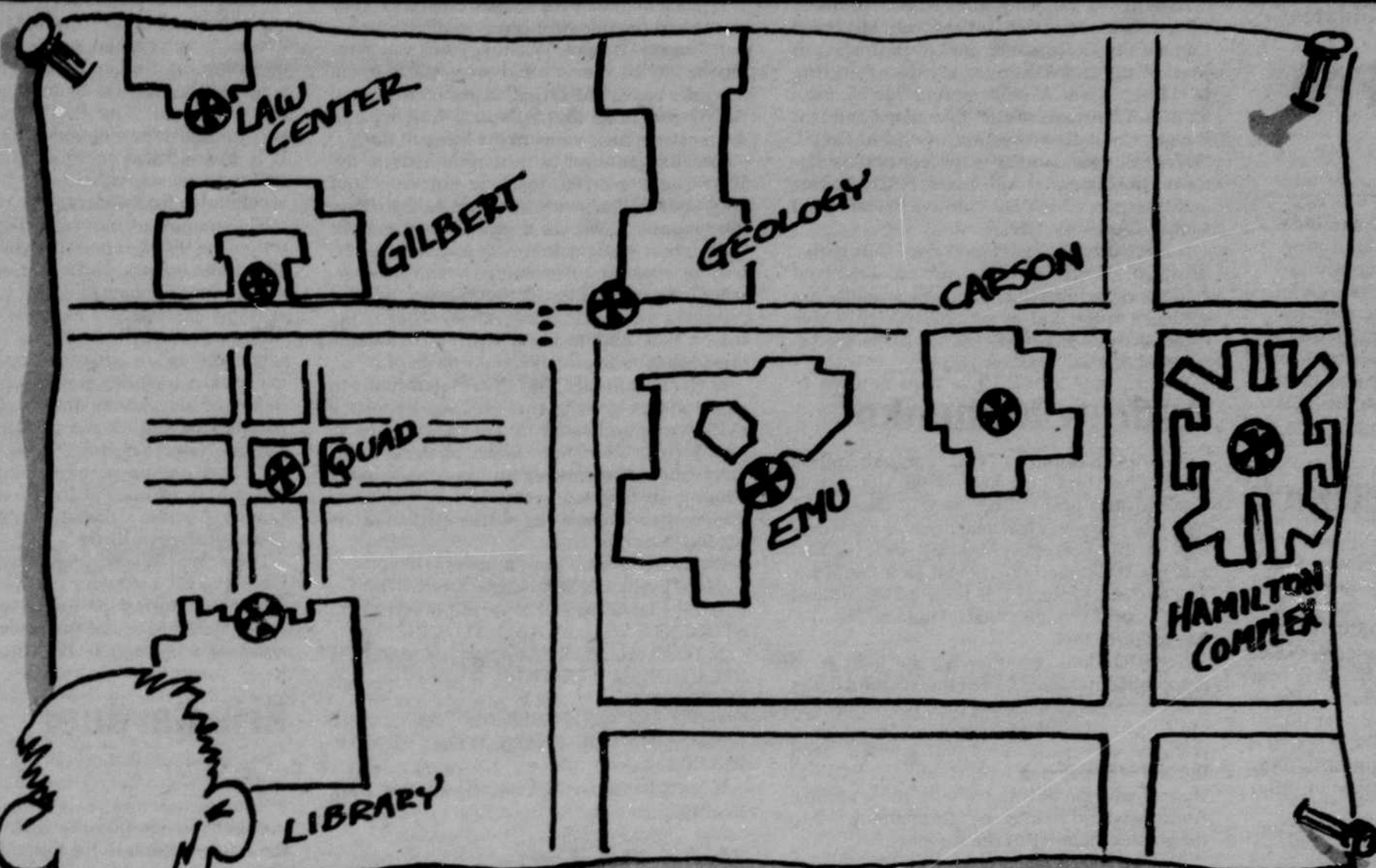


ASUO PRIMARY GENERAL ELECTIONS

HOW TO VOTE:

Bring plastic ID card and current term registration card to the polling place.

VOTING IS FROM 9-4 on Oct. 24, Oct. 25, Oct. 31 and Nov. 1.

VOTERS GUIDE

Constitutional Amendments

Change in Policy

1. Section 3.2 of the ASUO Constitution is amended to read: "No member of this Association shall simultaneously hold more than one elective office under this Constitution. No person may simultaneously hold an elective and appointive position or more than one appointive position unless the Constitution Committee shall determine that no potential conflict of interest exists between the positions."

The present provisions of Section 3.2 allow a person to hold more than one elective office unless the Constitution Committee determines potential conflict of interests exists. In looking to the other provisions of the Constitution it is hard to imagine a situation where a person could hold two elective offices and not be involved in some sort of conflict of interest.

2. 3.3 is amended to read: "Candidates for the SUAB should either have declared a major with the University Registrar or shall, at the time of filing for election, declare that he or she is a pre-major (undeclared) student. Candidates for the SUAB shall, at the time of filing, declare which constituent group they seek to represent."

3.31 If a member elected to the SUAB changes majors to one outside of the constituent group they were elected to represent, that member will no longer be eligible to serve on the SUAB and his or her position shall be declared vacant. 3.32 Notwithstanding 3.31, a member elected to the SUAB who is a pre-major (undeclared) student, may adopt a major and continue to serve on the SUAB until his or her term of office expires.

The present provisions of 3.3 allow SUAB members to retain the designated position even if major is changed.

3. Section 10.1 is amended to read: "The election for President- OSPIRG Board members, Student University Affairs Board

members, and EMU Board members shall be held no earlier than April 1 and no later than May 15 of each year. Elections for positions of the Incidental Fee Committee shall be held in the second half of October or the first half of November each year."

This amendment will establish a fall ASUO elections and clarifies a specific time period for ASUO Spring Elections.

4. 10.6 is amended to read: "any member of this association is eligible to vote for candidates seeking elective office, except in elections for SUAB members in which only members of the appropriate constituent group may vote for their representative."

The present provisions of 10.6 states "... except in elections for class officers where only members of a specific academic class may vote."

Grammar Changes

(original language is in parentheses, changes in bold)

1. 4.5 is amended to read: "The President shall hold veto powers over any or all of the alloca-

tions of the Incidental Fee Committee in their original budget allocations, over subsequent allocations from unallocated reserves, where such accounts are not broken down by program in the ASUO budget, and over allocations of surplus funds from carry-over and over-realized enrollment." The changes reflect a simple grammatical correction of the language in 4.5

2. 6.4 is amended to read: The Committee shall establish and publish its own rules of procedure and shall elect a presiding officer who shall be responsible for calling and presiding for meeting of the Committee. Again, this is a grammatical correction.

3. 6.9 is amended to read: "The committee shall, in the event that the ASUO President fails to meet the ASUO Budget recommendation deadline, (following) pursuant to consent of the Constitution Committee, be responsible for preparing the ASUO budget and submitting it to the University President."

4. 12.1 needs to be amended as follows: "The (electorate) membership shall have the power to recall any elected ASUO official by a majority vote."
