

March planned to aid demonstrators

The Trojan Decommissioning Alliance is sponsoring a downtown candlelight walk Sunday to show support for the civil disobedience activities planned at the Trident nuclear submarine base near Seattle.

Demonstrations and civil disobedience actions are planned throughout the country Sunday and Monday. In Bangor, Washington, Groton, Connecticut,

and Sunnyvale, California; civil disobedience actions are planned against each stage of the Trident nuclear submarine system. In New York City, protesters will be demanding that Wall Street stop servicing the nuclear industries and at the Soviet Embassy in San Francisco, protesters will call for Soviet disarmament.

The candlelight walk will

begin at 7 p.m. at the fountain on the downtown mall. From there, supporters will walk to the Federal Building at 7th Avenue and Pearl Street for a program on the arms race and converting to peaceful production.

On Monday, from 11:30 a.m. until 1:30 p.m., there will be picketing of the Navy Recruiting Office at 11th Avenue and Willamette Street.

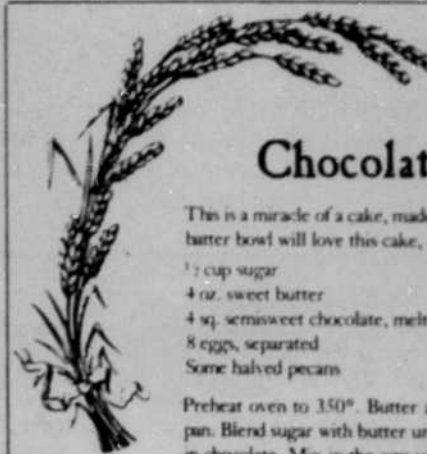

Chocolate Cream Cake

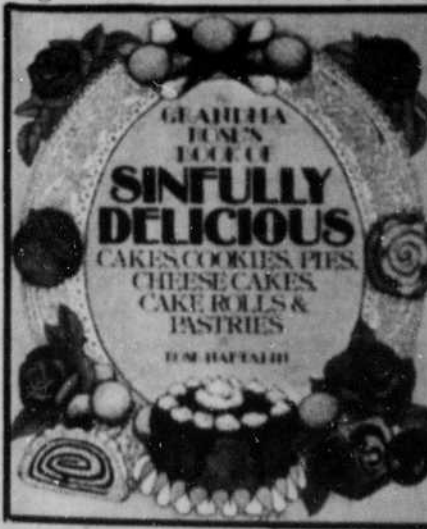
This is a miracle of a cake, made without flour. Everybody who loves to lick the butter bowl will love this cake, since it's iced with half the butter.

1 1/2 cup sugar
4 oz. sweet butter
4 sq. semisweet chocolate, melted and cooled
8 eggs, separated
Some halved pecans

Preheat oven to 350°. Butter and lightly flour an 8" square baking pan. Blend sugar with butter until the mixture is light and fluffy. Stir in chocolate. Mix in the egg yolks, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Beat egg whites until stiff and very carefully fold them into the chocolate mixture.

Pour half of the batter into baking pan, set in oven and immediately reduce heat to 300°. Pour the remaining batter into a bowl, cover and refrigerate. Bake the cake for 45 minutes, or until a wooden toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. Let the cake cool completely. Spread half of the reserved batter over the cake and chill until set. Spread the remaining batter over it and chill overnight. Cut the cake into 16 squares. Put pecans on top to decorate.

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
