

New visiting hours set for observatory

Revised visiting hours are now in effect for the University's Pine Mountain Observatory near Bend where scientists are studying Cygnus XI, a mysterious star system believed by many astronomers to contain a "black hole" and other celestial bodies.

The public is welcome to visit the observatory from 2 p.m. until 5 p.m. and from 7 p.m. until 8 p.m. Thursdays through Sundays. The site will be closed Mondays through Wednesdays.

"We've established these hours so visitors, most of whom drive long distances to reach the site, can be assured of finding the observatory open when they arrive," explained Dr.

Bernd Crasemann, University physics department head who chairs a committee that oversees observatory operations.

He stressed, however, that the revised schedule is not intended to prevent anyone from making special arrangements to visit at other times.

"Observatory caretaker Eugene Brandon regularly schedules school and other groups visits," Crasemann noted. He suggested those wishing to arrange visits outside of the established hours should call Brandon in Bend at 382-8331.

Depending on research schedules, visitors to Pine Mountain Observatory may have a chance to "look over the

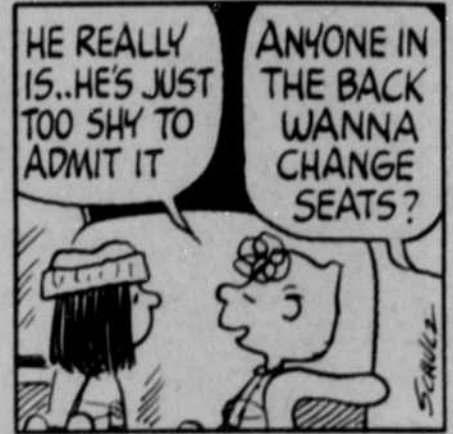
shoulders" of working astronomers who are studying exploding stars, planets, galaxies and other celestial objects.

Crasemann said the Cygnus XI project has produced measurements which represent "a sizeable portion of all of the existing light-curve and polarization data" about the X-ray emitting star system that may contain a black hole.

A black hole is a collapsed star that is so dense and has such strong gravity that no light can escape from it.

Located about 25 miles southeast of Bend on U.S. Highway 20, Pine Mountain Observatory is accessible by driving about seven miles south on a gravel road that leaves the highway just beyond the Millican store and gas station.
