"We are accepting applications from students who can take time off," Elliot said. "They will be placed in the offices of members of Congress and Washington organizations appropriate to their interests and studies."

ADA is a national liberal political

organization that has been one of the leaders in rallying support for Sen. Edward Kennedy. ADA has long fought hard for civil rights and liberties, against the war in Vietnam and for a sane non-nuclear policy.

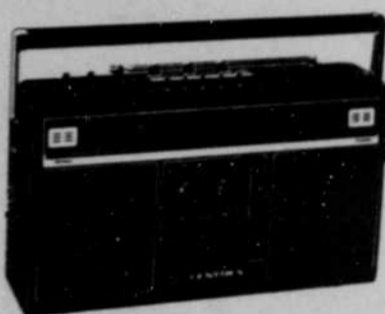

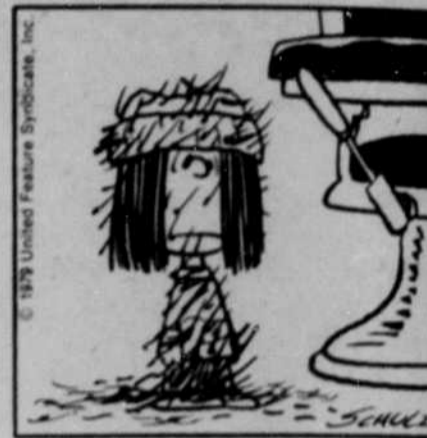
