

CEP changes registration program

Changes are being instituted this winter to make registration for University Community Education Program classes easier.

"Due to the large turnout in the fall, next quarter's pre-registration will take place in a larger space in the foyer of the Science III building," CEP coordinator Chris Munoz said. Pre-registration previously took place in Oregon Hall.

The pre-registration period will run Dec. 11-14 and Dec. 17, just one week instead of the usual two.

In another change, certain departments are making all of their classes available for pre-registration by CEP students.

Munoz listed those departments as chemistry, economics, English, German, Russian, history, math, physics and East Asian languages plus the

School of Community Service and Public Affairs.

The new winter term CEP schedule will be published in a special supplement to the Eugene Register-Guard on Monday, Dec. 10.

CEP registration for University courses not listed in the supplement will run 6:30 to 8 p.m. Jan. 4 at McArthur Court.
