

Advising program needs help

Students participating in the University's peer advisement program combine helping fellow students with on-the-job experience.

Peer advising is part of a student para-professional pro-

gram that selects and trains undergraduates to increase the responsiveness of University offices to student needs.

Seven departments currently have peer advising programs, including the psychology, sociology, political science, pre-health, science, and gerontology departments. Peer advisers are also available to undeclared majors.

Peer advisers keep office hours, talk to students about academic problems, answer

questions about careers and give out information on graduate schools. Peer advisers are expected to devote at least nine hours a week to the program. Most advisers receive practicum credit for their services.

Emerald subscriptions are \$7.00 per term and \$20 per year.

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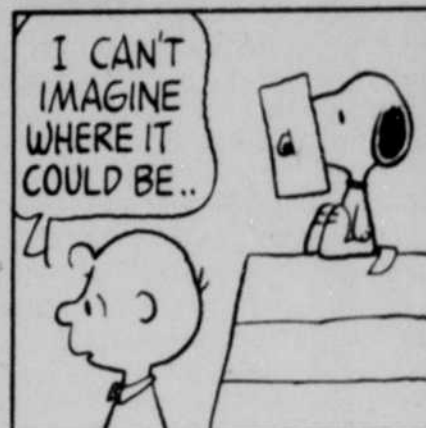
