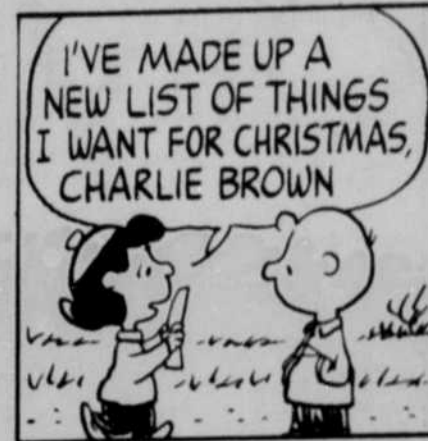
This year the University team has taken home honors in five out of six regional tournaments.
