

Abandoned bikes will be sold

If you're in the market for an inexpensive mode of transportation, you might be able to find a bargain Saturday, Dec. 8, when the University auctions about 50 bicycles abandoned on campus.

Inspection of the bikes will be from 9:30 until 10:30 a.m. and the auction from 10:30 a.m. to noon in the breezeway of the Erb Memorial Union. The union is located at the corner of 13th Avenue and University Student. "The bikes are of all makes and sizes, and some of them are in pretty good condition," says

Walter McLaughlin, director of business affairs. "There's a chance for some good bargains."

McLaughlin says every effort has been made to find the owners of abandoned bikes using any identification found on them.

The owners of traceable bikes are notified and then given 30 days to claim their bikes. After that grace period, the bikes can be auctioned off to the public.

"If an individual can bring proof in of the serial number of one of the bikes before the auc-

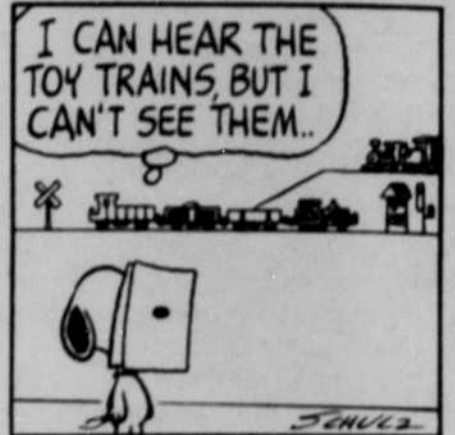
tion, he can get his bike back," McLaughlin says.

All the money from the auction will go into the Bicycle Control Account, which provides funding for bicyclists, including bike racks.

McLaughlin says purchasers who are members of the University community will have to pay their bid price plus \$2 to have the bicycle registered on campus.

This is the first time the University has auctioned abandoned bikes.
