

In response to Afghan invasion Double grain price to Soviets, says Weaver

Instead of a grain embargo to the Soviet Union, the United States should raise the price of grain sold to the Soviets, said Congressman Jim Weaver, D-Ore.

"That would hurt the Soviets much more than the present embargo because it would direct money they need away from their military budget. That's the kind of penalty they should be made to pay for their aggression in Afghanistan," Weaver said at the South Lane Issues Forum Monday in Cottage Grove. Weaver proposed to more than double the price of corn and wheat sold to Russia.

Dave Fidanque, a Weaver press aide, said the price rise wouldn't halt the Soviet invasion of Afghanistan, but the embargo won't halt the invasion either and "price rises would make them (the Soviets) pay for it. The important thing is to make them understand we're not going to let this slide by as if nothing has happened," Fidanque said.

Weaver said that increased grain

profits should be used to reimburse farmers and to aid starving people in areas such as Cambodia. The federal government would, in Weaver's plan, act as middleman in these transactions.

Weaver also advocated setting higher prices for other grains exported by the United States.

Weaver, who is chief sponsor of a bill in Congress that would establish a national grain board to set minimum grain export prices, said that because of the dominance of the United States in the world grain exporting markets the United States, Canada and Australia should unite to create the "OPEC of grain."

Otherwise, Weaver said, international grain companies will eventually be buying grain from the United States at low prices and selling it abroad for exorbitant profits.

Fidanque said raising grain prices would be more effective on the Soviets because "they have finite financial resources, and the embargo hurts us. There's a lot of farmers who stand to lose a lot."
