working for peace in all countries around the world.

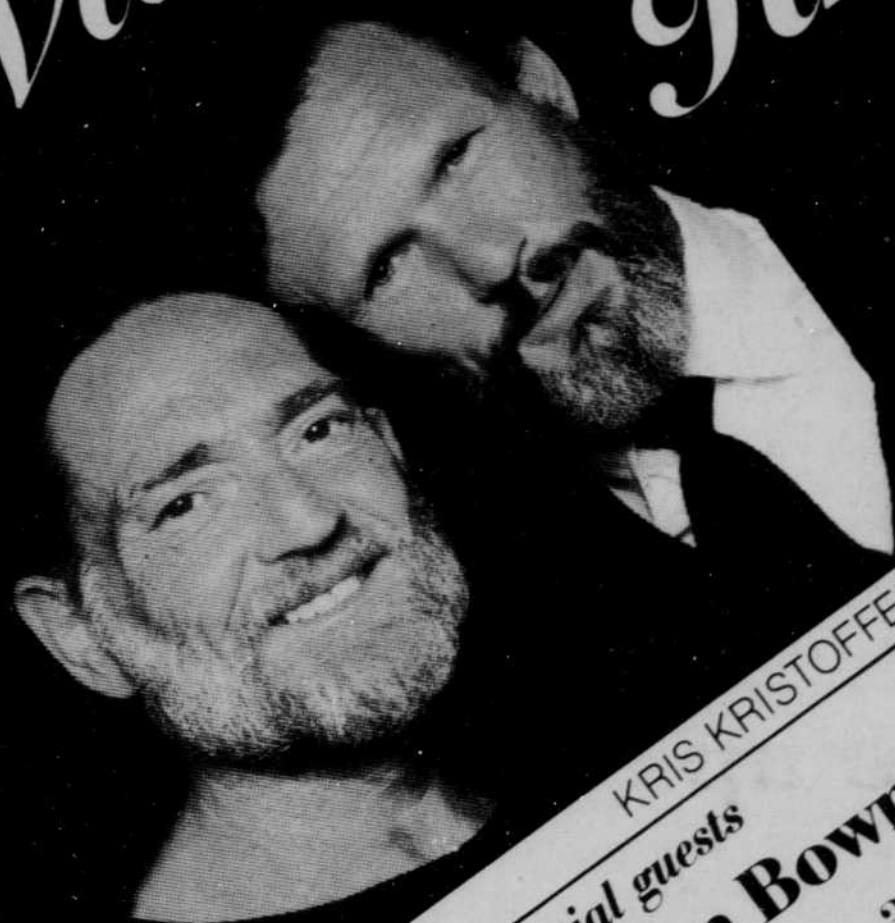
