Conflicts between economic development on Indian reservations and traditional tribal values in the Pacific Northwest will be the focus of a day-long symposium on Friday, Jan. 25, at the University.

Sponsored by the University Native American Student Union,

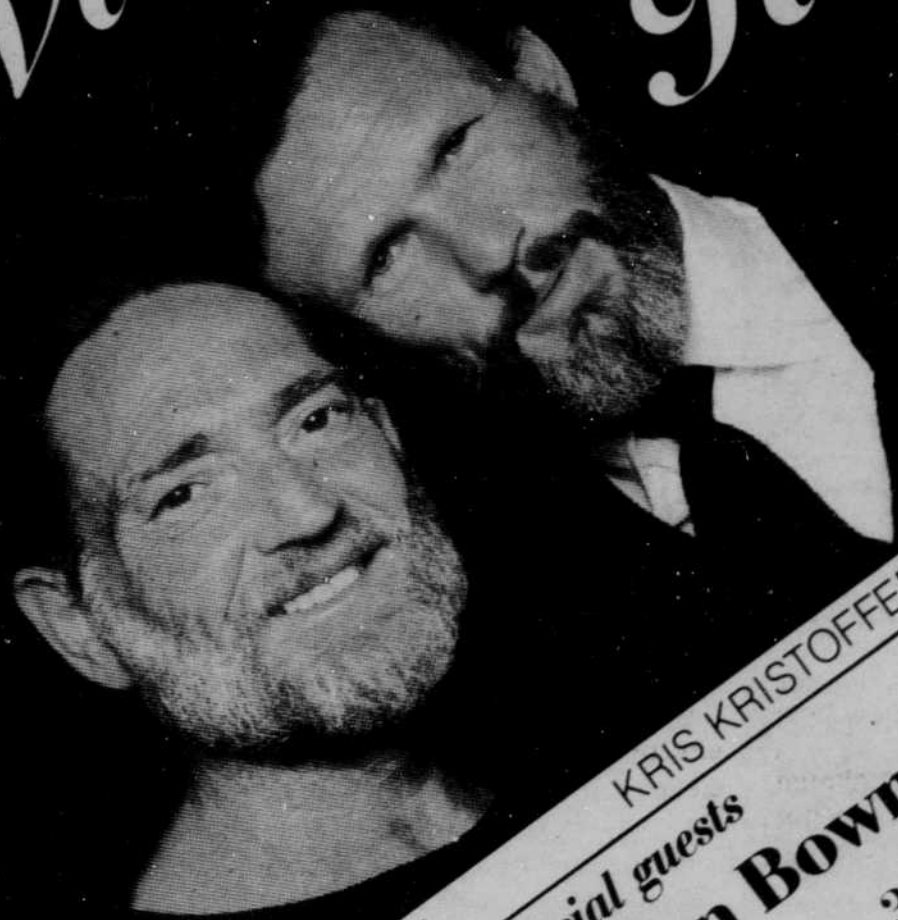

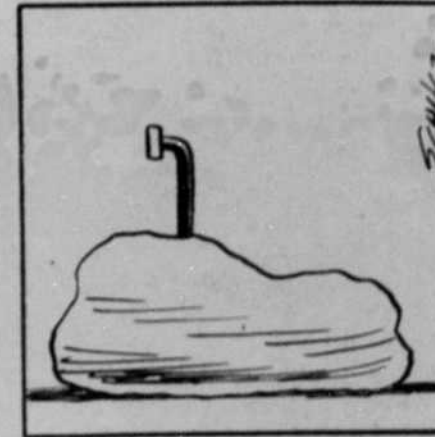
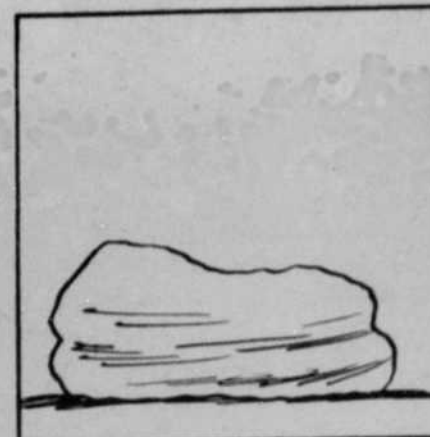

tion of officers, fund-raising and possible cooperation with AEI.

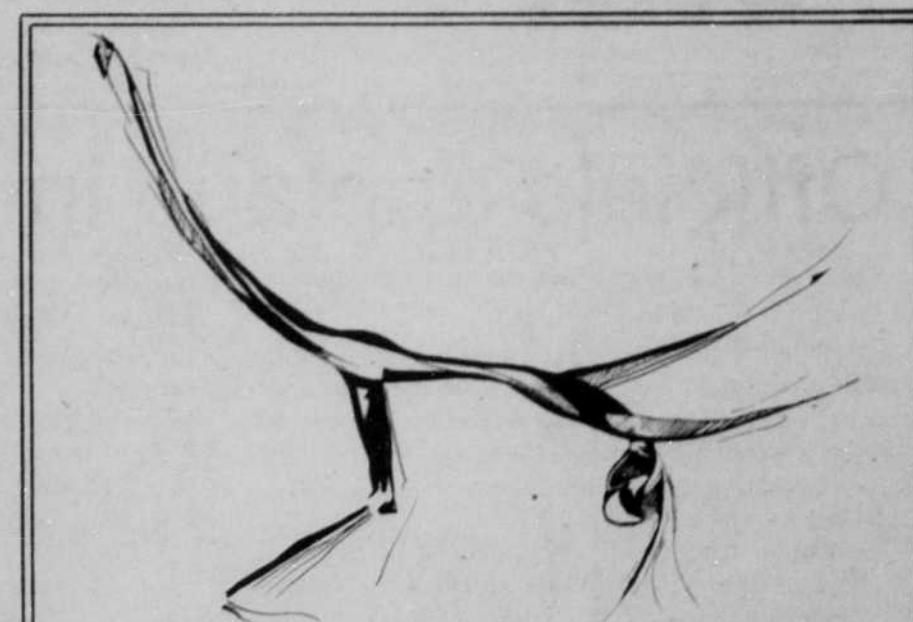
LECTURES
