

Program to study Islam

The Muslim Student Association will sponsor a symposium on the Islam religion Wednesday and Thursday between 10 a.m. and 10 p.m. in Room 167 EMU.

The program will include a series of lectures, discussions, films, slides and a book exhibition. Each presentation will touch upon the political, econ-

omic, social and religious aspects of Islam — a lifestyle that encompasses 800 million people.

The symposium will also include the showing of the three-hour film, "Mohammad, Messenger of God," starring Anthony Quinn and Irene Papas.

The goal of the symposium, according to the MSA, is to present information about Islam

that is not usually available to this part of the world. The MSA hopes that it will positively contribute to the advancement of international interfaith and understanding.

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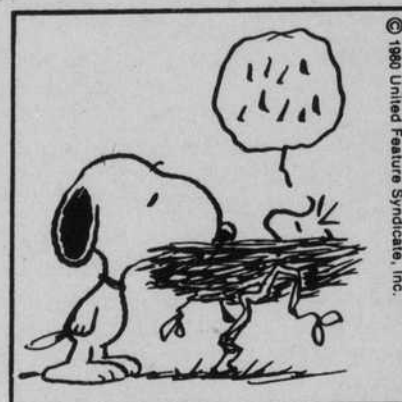
