

Bicycle citations to increase

Stricter enforcement of University bicycle parking regulations will begin Feb. 1, says Don Brooks, assistant director of the Department of Public Safety.

In addition, free registration of bicycles will end this term. Beginning in late March, persons licensing their bikes for campus use will be charged \$2.

"We don't plan a 'sweep' of

the campus to locate bikes that are in violation of the ordinance," says Brooks, "but we will be taking a tougher stand on those that endanger public safety or cause damage to property because of how or where they are parked."

Brooks says that the stepped-up enforcement and imposition of a registration fee are "all part of the campus bike

plan. The money generated from these measures will be used to support the plan's goal of improving the conditions on campus for bicyclists and motorists alike."

Owners of registered bicycles that are illegally parked will be cited, says Brooks. Unregistered bikes will be impounded at the public safety office.

Copies of the University bicycle parking regulations, including a list of fees and fines, are available at the public safety department in Straub Hall.



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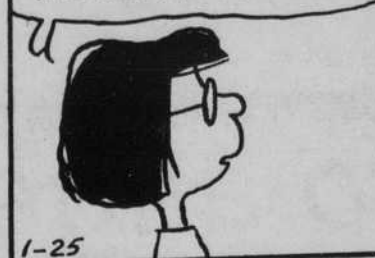

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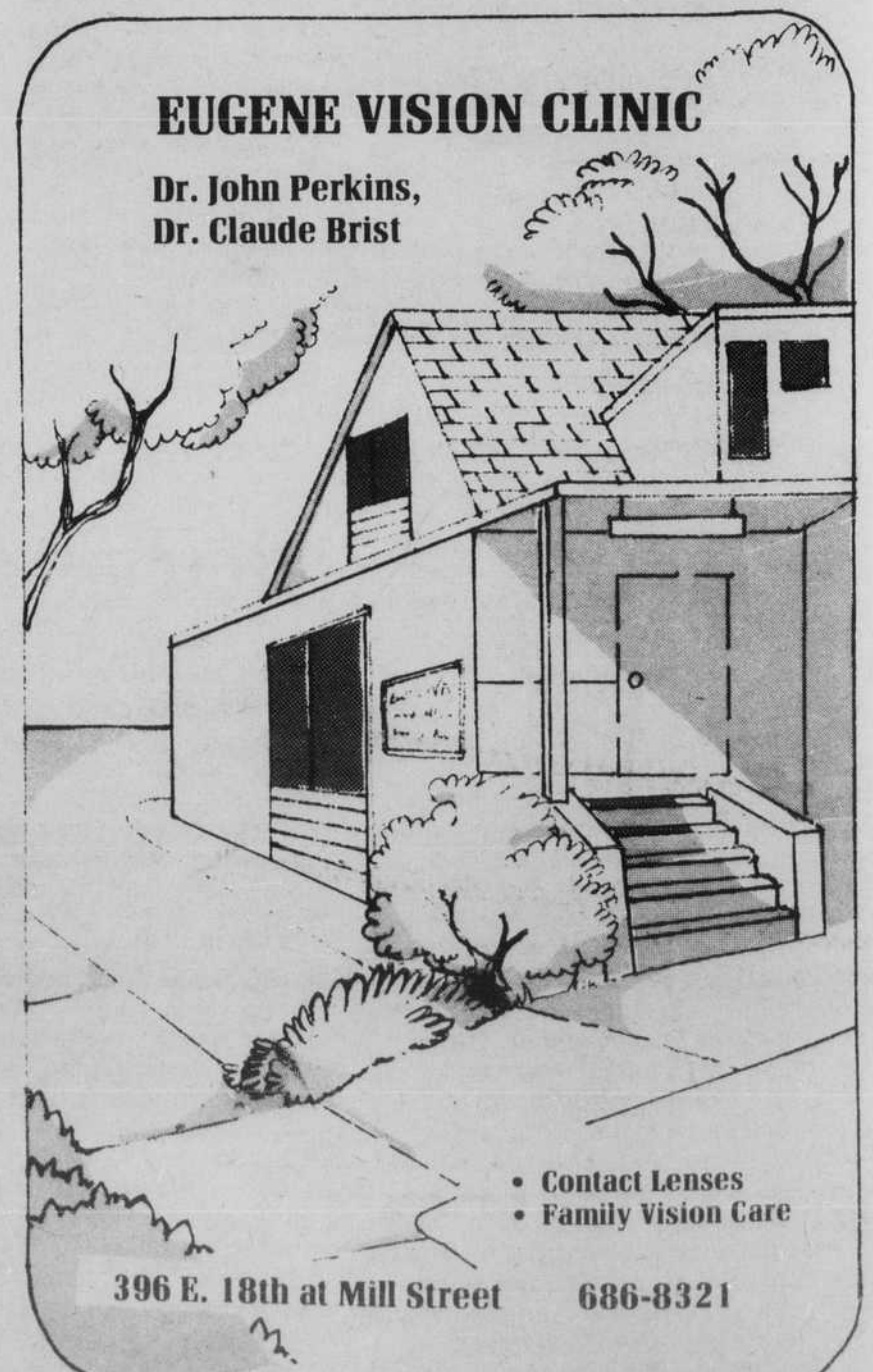
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
