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News errors on energy shown

Press errors in covering energy issues will be the subject of a University Colloquium at 2:30 p.m. Tuesday in the journalism reading room, 211 Allen.

University Physics Profs. Joeal McClure and Amit Goswami will present examples of stories containing technically incorrect information as well as stories they say miss the significance of energy developments.

McClure and Goswami both have taught general science courses dealing with solar and energy conservation.

Members of the working press as well as the general public are welcome, says James Lemert, University journalism professor.

"Proposal claiming to be energy-saving devices are often developed without thorough understanding of energy use,"

McClure says. "For example, the use of hydrogen for fuel is indeed possible, but the energy must be used to take the hydrogen out — a very expensive task that is often overlooked."

McClure indicated he and Goswami hope the colloquium will offer helpful background information for current and future reporters who tell the public about energy developments and issues.
