All foreign students resident in the United States must submit immediately an address report to the U.S. Immigration Service.

The report should be made on a post card (Form I-35), available at any post office.

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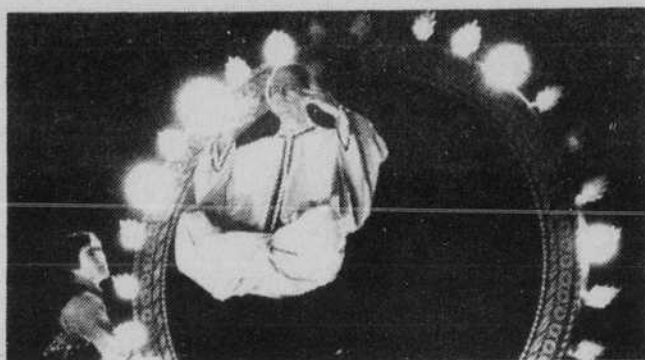

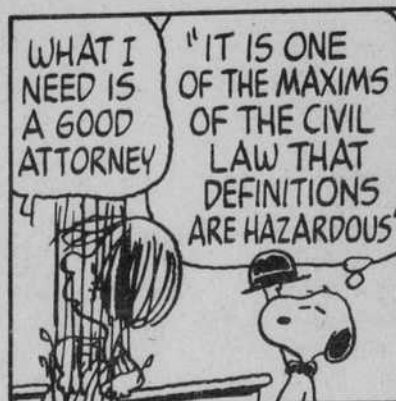

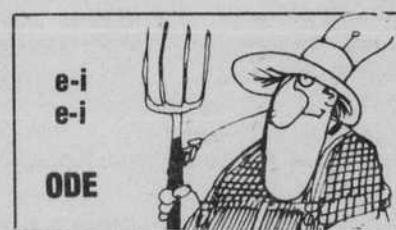
