A former ombudsman for the Washington Post, a Newspaper Advertising Bureau representative and a market research executive will be among featured speakers at the 61st annual Oregon Press Conference to be held Friday, Feb. 15, at the University journalism school.

All events except the luncheon and dinner will be at Allen Hall, Room 221.

Ben Bagdikian, professor of journalism at the University of California Berkeley and former ombudsman and assistant managing editor at the Washington Post, will speak on "The 1980s: Basic change for the Press?"


John Temple-Raston, vice president and regional manager for the Newspaper Advertising Bureau, San Francisco, will discuss a national study on women and newspapers at 3:15 p.m.

Roy Bardsley, president of Bardsley and Laslacher, a market research firm in Portland, will speak on "What We've Learned About Oregonians and Their Newspapers" at 10:45.

School of Journalism Dean Galen Rarick says the conference is an effort on the part of the journalism school to "be of service to the press of this state; to get to know these people and let them get to know us."
