

# Olympic movement discussed

Former Olympic track coach LeRoy Walker will speak on the future of the Olympic Games Thursday, March 6, at 12:30 p.m. in the EMU Ballroom.

Walker, the U.S. track and field coach for the Montreal games in 1976, now serves on the executive board of the U.S. Olympic Committee. His lecture

is entitled "The Olympic Movement: Is It Dead or Alive?"

On Thursday evening in 242 Gerlinger at 7:30, Walker will discuss the pentathlon program of the President's Council on Physical Fitness and Sports with high school coaches and teachers. Walker is the program's national chairman.

Walker will spend Friday, March 7, visiting health, physical education and recreation classes and meeting with athletic department officials.

The University Assembly and Lectures Committee and College of Health, Physical Education and Recreation are sponsoring Walker's visit.
