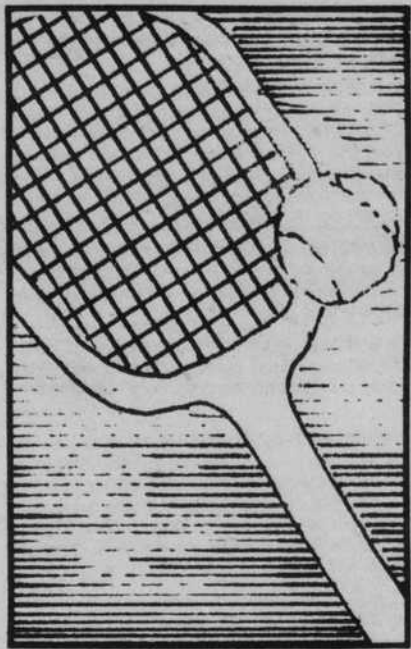


Men netters lose to Portland

The Oregon men's tennis team lost a close decision Sunday to the University of Portland, 5-4, in the title match of the University of Oregon Team Tournament, thus placing second in the round-robin tourney. Boise State shut out Whitman College earlier in the morning to capture third place.

Both Oregon and Portland went into the match with 2-0 tourney records, but the Portland netters were just a little too tough for the Ducks. "We played good tennis," said Oregon coach Buzz Summers, "and it could have gone either way. It was a hard-fought match and they just played a little bit better than us today. It was very close and a few breaks either way could have made a difference."

The Ducks won two out of three in the doubles competition, but



were outscored 4-2 in singles play. The doubles team of Eric Lehto-Steve Bolstad went un-

defeated for Oregon in the tourney, defeating Portland's Doug Menkey and Kim Gourley, 2-6, 7-6, 6-4, on Sunday. "Lehto and Bolstad are our strongest doubles team and they really played well throughout the tourney," said Summers.

Tom Greider was the outstanding singles player for the Ducks, winning all three of his matches in the tourney. He defeated Doug Menke of Portland Sunday, 3-6, 6-3, 6-4. Both Greider and Lehto made the all-tournament team for the Ducks.

Oregon's season record is now 8-3 and they will play at home this Friday against Pacific Lutheran at 2:30 p.m. The match will be held at the 15th Street Courts in the event of good weather or at the covered courts behind Esslinger in case of rain.

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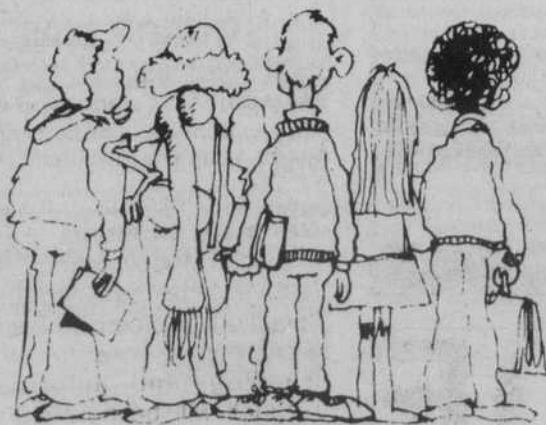
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
